Free School Meal and Pupil Premium Grant

The Pupil Premium Grant is funding that the school gets from the DfE to support disadvantaged and vulnerable children. To qualify for the funding pupils need to be in receipt of free school meals.

Even if you have applied before for free school meals or if your child is in Yr-Y2 and receives universal free school meals anyway, it may still be worth checking if you could be eligible and allow the school to access this funding.

The simplest way to do this is to have a look on the Cornwall Council website using this link School meals - Cornwall Council or if you are happy for us to do so we can check in school - just ask Mrs Hancock to check for you.

The Schools census which determines our budget for next year is on Thursday 5th

October so if you do think you might be eligible then please apply soon!
